A Livelihood Programme Empowering Women Artisans Through Skill Development was conducted at Saraguri Chapori, Sivasagar District, Assam for 20 artisans under the CSR Scheme of Oil & Natural Gas Corporation Limited (ONGC), Assam Asset, Nazira. The programme was organised for 60 days from **18.04.19 -18.06.19**.

The training is aimed to remove the hurdles of the artisans of the adopted area in the production of the quality items to give a boost in the Marketing of the handicrafts products in the world market. The artisans were introduced into the new designs by remixing, adopting new designs, value addition to cope with the future growing market demand and conserving the EXISTING designs in to the modern world.. It is also hope that the crafts persons of the area can stand their own foot in respect of marketing of their product increasing quality of their items. At the last day of the training programme, certificates were also distributed to all the artisans for their active participation.
